Invited Speakers



Mary Dawood

Mary Dawood has held the post of Consultant Nurse in Emergency Nursing at Imperial College Healthcare Trust London for the past seven years. Prior to this post she worked for two years as a Lecturer/Practitioner where she taught both

pre- and post-registration nursing focusing particularly on the education and training of nurse practitioners. She has a Post Graduate Diploma in Teaching in Healthcare and is registered with the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) as a Lecturer/Practice Educator. As a Nurse Consultant Mary has pursued both an academic and clinical career and has a high profile in emergency nursing in the UK. In addition to her nursing qualifications, Mary has an Honours degree in Social Science and a Masters degree in Medical Sociology. She has published numerous papers on the subject of emergency nursing and is an established speaker, having presented at conferences both nationally and internationally.



Glenn Gardner

Professor Glenn Gardner RN PhD FRCNA is Foundation Chair and Professor of Clinical Nursing at the Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital and Queensland University of Technology, and is Director of the Centre for Clinical Nursing. Glenn

has an extensive background and strong track record in acute care research with a focus on nursing practice innovations and interventions. The second arm of Glenn's research program is in health and nursing service innovation. Glenn is recognised nationally and internationally for her research into advanced practice nursing and the practice and health service role of the nurse practitioner. She was lead investigator for the ACT Nurse Practitioner trial and headed up the team that conducted the Australia and New Zealand Nurse Practitioner Standards project.



Mary Chiarella

Mary Chiarella is Professor of Nursing in the Faculty of Nursing and Midwifery at the University of Sydney and is a respected nurse, midwife, author and academic. She has worked as the Chief Nurse for NSW where she was responsible for a workforce

of over 45,000 nurses in NSW, providing clinical and planning advice to the Minister for Health. She was a founding member of the Australian Bioethics Association and the Australian Institute for Health, Law and Ethics. She helped establish the world's first Doctor of Midwifery course at the University of Technology, Sydney (UTS), was the Foundation Professor of Nursing in Corrections Health, NSW and has been a key player in a host of nursing, education and health planning committees.



Michelle Kelly, RN, BSc, MN, PhD

Michelle Kelly is leading the integration of simulation and technologies into curricula at the Faculty of Nursing, Midwifery and Health, University of Technology, Sydney (UTS). Faculty initiatives focus on preparation for clinical practice, patient

safety, clinical judgment, and interdisciplinary simulation. Ms Kelly is a founding committee member of the Australian Society for Simulation in Healthcare (ASSH), member of the Simulated Learning Environments reference group for the COAG National Health Workforce Taskforce and reviewer for the *Clinical Simulation in Nursing* journal.



Robert Crouch OBE, RN, PhD, FRCN

Robert Crouch is Consultant Nurse in the Emergency Department at Southampton University Hospitals NHS Trust and Honorary Associate Professor, Warwick Medical School – University of Warwick. Robert has an extensive background

in Emergency Nursing. As well being a clinical nurse he is a respected academic in emergency care and holds academic appointments at the University of Southampton and Warwick. He has lectured and published extensively and is on the editorial boards of *International Emergency Nursing* and *Emergency Medicine Journal*.



Lieutenant Commander Lisa Conlon

Royal Australian Navy (Reserves)
Lisa Conlon gained her initial nursing qualification in Queensland and joined the Royal Australian Navy in January 1994. She served for 12 years as a Naval

Nursing Officer in the permanent forces and transferred to the Naval Reserve in late 2006. Lisa's specialties are in casualty assessment, trauma nursing and operating theatre management.

Lisa has undergraduate and postgraduate qualifications in nursing and is currently undertaking doctoral studies examining the functioning of military and civilian trauma teams.



Brian Dolan, MSc (Oxon), MSc (Lond), RMN, RGN

Brian Dolan undertook his psychiatric nursing in Ireland and did his general nurse training in St Mary's Hospital, London and worked clinically in a range of emergency departments.

Brian is Director of Dolan & Holt Consultancy Ltd in the UK and works with organisations undertaking leadership development, improvement in patient flow and systems reform.

Brian Dolan is also Director of Service Improvement and Patient Flow, Canterbury District Health Board, NZ, where his role includes work on the Improving the Patient Journey programme incorporating ED and the ward-based Making Time for Caring projects.
